The Current State of Health in Oregon

- The cost of health insurance premiums for families in Oregon have **increased 125%** in the last 10 years.
- Medical costs have grown at **twice the rate of inflation** for the last 5 years.
- Heart disease, certain cancers, obesity, and diabetes account for almost **75% of all health care costs**. They are all **largely preventable** or even reversible.



Oregon's Path to Health Reform

- 2005: Westlund-Bates Senate Special Committee on Health Care Reform
- 2008: Oregon Health Fund Board (OHFB)
- 2009: Oregon Health Authority, Oregon Health Policy Board created
- 2010: Federal reform enacted.**
- OHA and OHPB work underway. Recommendations to Legislature by December.***
- 2014: Major pieces of federal reform implemented
- 2015: Quality, affordable coverage for all Oregonians



Health Reform in Oregon: HB 2009

In 2009, the Oregon Legislature created the Oregon Health Authority, Oregon Health Policy Board.

- Directs OHPB to create and implement a plan so all Oregonians have quality, affordable coverage by 2015.
- Directs OHPB to submit a business plan for a health insurance exchange.




What is the Oregon Health Authority?

The Oregon Health Authority works with the nine-member citizen Oregon Health Policy Board on comprehensive health and health care reform in our state.

Oregon Health Fund Board's (2007-08) *Building Blocks of Health Reform*

- **Create OHA and OHPB**
 - Transition complete by July 2011
- **Bring everyone under the tent**
 - Oregon Health Plan
 - Healthy Kids Program
 - Insurance Exchange
- **Unify purchasing power**



Building Blocks of Health Reform

- **Set statewide standards for quality**
 - All payer, all claims database
 - Establishing statewide quality benchmarks
- **Ensure equity** in health and health care
- **Address provider shortages** and prepare a 21st century workforce



Building Blocks of Health Reform

- **Stimulate system innovation** to reduce costs and improve quality, access and lifelong health
 - Focus on preventive care
 - Integrate mental health care and addiction services
 - Provide patient-centered care with improved outcomes
 - Secure, private electronic medical records



Building Blocks of Health Reform

- **Stimulate system innovation** (continued)
 - Build on community health and prevention efforts
 - Pay for outcomes rather than services
 - Reduce administration and red-tape
 - Provide high quality and dignified end-of-life care
 - Medical liability reform



Federal support for Oregon's work

- **Population health**
 - Focus on prevention and health promotion
- **Delivery system reform**
 - Payment reform, Medicare payment changes, health center funding and workforce issues
- **Coverage and Access in 2014**
 - Reforms remove barriers to coverage
 - **Largely takes care of financing piece for expanding coverage in Oregon**
 - **65% of uninsured Oregonians will gain coverage**
 - **90% of Oregonians will have coverage**



Federal population health opportunities

- Significant investments in prevention and public health
 - \$25 million for child obesity
 - \$190 million for strengthening public health surveillance
 - Requires certain preventive services to be free (i.e. Medicare)
- National prevention and health promotion strategy
- Menu labeling required in chain restaurants (20+ locations) and vending machines





Working within the triple aim

- Improving lifelong health and focusing on prevention
- Improving access to quality care
- Lowering or containing costs



Stroke related work

- Oregon Emergency Healthcare Task Force
- Oregon Health Improvement Plan Committee
 - Bridge between community and clinic
 - Focusing on prevention and improving health
- Value-based benefit package
 - Tiers of cost-sharing based on evidence of value
- Electronic medical records (HITOC)



Future points of interest

- Patient centered primary care homes
 - Proactive management and support of individuals with chronic diseases
- Incentives and outcomes
 - Payment reform and quality
- Regional HIE centers
